
It's #SoNotCrap and you're invited

Everyone is invited to get involved with #SoNotCrap events in February, for a thought-provoking exploration of how East Gippsland is safeguarding its beautiful, natural environment through the smart use of recycled water.

The #SoNotCrap exhibition will run from 7 to 28 February, showcasing some fantastic images and short films submitted over recent weeks by East Gippslanders and visitors to the region, which will be displayed on the projection wall at Bairnsdale Library and at other key locations. There will be a People's Choice Award of a GoPro for the best entry, so the public are encouraged to vote for their favourite.

Bairnsdale's Water Tower in Main Street will be the backdrop for the public launch of #SoNotCrap on Saturday 7 February, with the inside of the tower providing the canvas for a captivating audio and visual experience to stimulate the senses. This is the work of artist Sue O'Connor, who conceived the #SoNotCrap initiative, with starring roles going to East Gippsland Water's Bairnsdale Wastewater Treatment Plant and the adjacent, internationally significant Macleod Morass. She set out to capture the interdependence of both sites, with the flora and fauna of the morass thriving on recycled fresh water produced by the treatment plant.

Complementing this, there will also be tours of the plant and morass running on the Saturday. Find out how the plant is treating wastewater and turning it into high quality recycled water suitable for reuse in the morass. In addition, learn more about the cultural, historical and environmental significance of the morass with rangers from Parks Victoria and the Gunaikurnai Land and Waters Aboriginal Corporation (GlaWAC) as your guides.

All the events are free and there is no need to pre-book. Simply turn up, and in the case of the tours, ensure you have sensible footwear and a hat.

Sue O'Connor said of the initiative "East Gippsland has a wonderful and beautiful environment where it is great place to live and work. #SoNotCrap gives everyone the opportunity to look with fresh eyes at our towns and the environment and to think about how we manage water and wastewater.

"We don't like to think about sewerage, but East Gippsland is showing that if you manage it well, you make your towns more liveable and you protect and enrich endangered habitats such as the Macleod Morass in Bairnsdale.

"The response from the public to the exhibition has been terrific, with some fantastic photos and videos submitted. We now invite the community to further embrace #SoNotCrap by casting their vote for the best and popping along to the other events organised for the month, such as the water tower experience and the tours. I also encourage you to post your photos and stories on social media – using #SoNotCrap hashtag of course!"
