Lindenow South water tank comes down

Work starts later this month to dismantle East Gippsland Water's disused, 18 metre high water tank in Lindenow South.



Coming down

The 60,000 litre steel tank, constructed in the 1950s and located by the Lindenow-Glenaladale Rd, had been used until recently to gravity-feed drinking water from the nearby water storages at Woodglen to the local community.

It is no longer required following a significant upgrade to the local water supply system, which means water is now fed directly from the Woodglen storages to the community by highly efficient pumps, providing customers with a notable increase in their water pressure.

East Gippsland Water has commissioned demolition experts City Circle to dismantle the water tank, with work expected to start on 12 February and take approximately one week to complete.

Said East Gippsland Water's Managing Director, Bruce Hammond: "As the Lindenow South water tank is no longer needed it makes sense to remove it, rather than incur future maintenance costs for a large, redundant piece of equipment.

"We thank nearby residents for their cooperation while the dismantling work is underway and every effort will be made to keep any inconvenience to a minimum."
