II Capital works update

We have some important capital works projects taking place and some still in the pipeline, to ensure our infrastructure is continually improved and to boost capacity for customers.

Our current capital works include:

- Combined heat and power units upgrades at the Bairnsdale Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Relocation of effluent pipeline at Scriveners Track crossing Mississippi Creek
- Installation of groundwater monitoring bores at Omeo, Dinner Plain, Cann River, Mallacoota, Orbost and Lindenow wastewater treatment plants
- Upgrade of Cann River water pumping station
- South Bairnsdale industrial estate supply upgrades

Water conservation

While there are no water restrictions currently in place, it's important to remember that permanent water-saving rules still apply. These guidelines provide a common-sense approach to the everyday use of our drinking water. With thousands of extra people visiting our region for the summer, this puts increased pressure on our water supply systems – so sensible use of our drinking water is important.
